Two on-going projects for the group are the community website and the recording of local memorials from WWI & II.

Dainis Ozols said that we were making progress with the community website, the first pages will be the Community Council pages. Jess Fromant who is the main webmaster has done considerable work so that it should not be very long before the initial pages will be 'live'. She stressed that it will be some time before the website is complete, and we all are anxious to include all aspects of the community and everyone within it.

Evelyn Bally had sent a list of the roll of honour in Bryngwyn Church and initial investigations had not progressed very far. Powys County Council are anxious to record as much information on the memorials within Powys and they have put a toolkit on their website for residents to use to investigate their local memorials. There are 20 names from WWI and one from WWII. John Meredith was able to throw some light on the names and retold the sad story of Fusiler SGO Jones in WWII, it appears that the WWI roll of honour is not a list of the fallen but a list of men who signed up for WWI, so further investigations are needed. The vicar (Rev Ben Griffith) is keen to help and hopefully will be able to add to our knowledge.

The meeting concluded with people chatting and sharing hints, memories etc over a cup of tea and a biscuit.
